This comprehensive young fathers program is aimed at strengthening the parental skills of younger dads residing in Ward 7 of the District of Columbia. Life skills coaches for this program will be certified by the nationally acclaimed *100 Fathers, Inc.* organization and they will be supported by the *Children's Rights Fund*.

This program is made possible by a capacity building grant from the *East River Family Strengthening Collaborative and DC Child and Family Services Agency*.

According to Jerrod Mustaf, Executive Director of the Take Charge Program, "less than 12% of youth residing in Ward 7, live in dual-parent homes. This fact alone makes it vital that fathers are involved with their children and have the necessary skills and tools to develop a well-rounded child."
